GURINGAI FESTIVAL 2017 POSTER COMPETITION FOR PRIMARY SCHOOL STUDENTS

Entries close 5pm, 31st March 2017

Purpose of the competition

Founded in 2001, the Guringai Festival aims to raise awareness of Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander people living in the Northern Sydney region. 'Connections' is the 2017 Guringai Festival theme. **Connections of people and place, Connections of communities, Connections of parents and children.** The Guringai Festival Committee invites primary school students to create an artwork that reflects these themes and the nature of the Festival. There is an opportunity for your artwork to then be chosen as the cover of the Guringai Festival program and poster image for 2017.

All entries must be submitted by the following conditions or will be ineligible:

Requirements

- 1. Entry is only open to students who attend Primary Schools within the Hornsby Shire, Hunters Hill, Ku-ring-gai, Lane Cove, Mosman, Northern Beaches, North Sydney, City of Ryde and Willoughby council areas.
- 2. Entries must be received by 5pm, Friday 31 March 2017.
- 3. The artwork must be A4 sized and remain rectangular.
- 4. The artwork must be an original and hand drawn or painted. Collage is acceptable. No framed works will be accepted.
- 5. Artwork will be judged on artistic merit and relevance to the purpose of the competition.
- 6. The artwork must relate directly to the Guringai Festival 2017 theme 'CONNECTIONS'.

Winners

- 7. The Promoter is the Guringai Festival committee consisting of members from Hornsby Shire, Hunters Hill, Ku-ring-gai, Lane Cove, Mosman, Northern Beaches, North Sydney, City of Ryde and Willoughby councils, as well as other reconciliation and community groups throughout the Northern Sydney region.
- 8. The Judging Panel will be made up of members of the Guringai Festival committee.
- 9. Winners will be notified by telephone before 5pm Friday 5th May 2017.
- 10. The winner of the competition will have their artwork (or part of their artwork) used on the cover of the 2017 Guringai Festival brochure as well as the promotional poster for the Festival.
- 11. The winner will receive a prize voucher for Westfield valued at \$100, donated by Harbour to Hawkesbury for Reconciliation. No cash payment will be given.
- 12. Additional selected entries may also be featured throughout the 2017 brochure. No payment or prize will be awarded to these artists.
- 13. Artworks may be edited to suit the design of the brochure and poster.
- 14. Selected entries will be placed on exhibition throughout the Festival. Location to be determined.
- 15. Prizes are not transferable, cannot be exchanged and non-cash prizes cannot be taken as cash.
- 16. All entries become the property of the Promoter and at any time the entries, and or reproductions of the entries, may be used as The Promoter sees fit for promotional purposes and/or public display without payment of any fee to the entrant.
- 17. The Promoter collects entrants' personal information in order to conduct the promotion and will not use this information for any other purpose.

- 18. By entering the promotion each entrant agrees that the Promoter may use the name and school of the entrant in any media for future promotional, branding, marketing and publicity purposes without any further notification, payment or other compensation to the entrant.
- 19. Employees (and their immediate families) of the Guringai Festival committee and judging panel associated with this promotion, are ineligible to win prizes.

Entry form

- 20. Once you have read and agreed to the terms and conditions, download, print and complete the entry form from **guringaifestival.com.au**
- 21. Application form must be signed by a parent or guardian if the child is under 16 years of age.
- 22. In the case where groups of students enter a combined entry, each individual student within the group must complete an 'Applicant Entry Details' section and attach to the back of their entry.
- 23. One entry per person only.
